Dear Representative Lofgren:

Thank you for your February 12, 2026 letter concerning reported Department of Homeland Security (DHS) activities occurring on or near Fort Hunter Liggett (FHL), and any current or contemplated coordination between DHS and the Army related to the use of FHL facilities, personnel, or surrounding infrastructure. I have been asked to respond on behalf of the Secretary of the Army, Dan Driscoll.

Currently, FHL is not aware of any plans or intentions for DHS to utilize FHL facilities. No FHL police officers are patrolling Jolon Road in an immigration enforcement capacity. Patrol actions conducted by FHL police during traffic stops are consistent for all individuals, regardless of the type of driver's license presented. A non-resident driver's license does not alter standard procedures. Army Regulation 190-45 requires FHL police officers to inform the appropriate agency for follow on coordination if subsequent checks through California Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (CLETS) or National Crime Information Center (NCIC) reveal that the individual has a warrant, illegal status, or other actionable concerns.

I look forward to continuing the dialogue on security efforts on and around Fort Hunter Liggett. Thank you for your continued support for the United States Army.
